Malcolm D. Hill, age 34, passed away on Thursday, February 20, 2025, in St. George, Utah. He was born on March 22, 1990, in Brigham City, Utah, to Linda Hill and Eliot D. Hill.

Malcolm served honorably in the Army National Guard from 2008 to 2020 with the 213th FED SPT Company. He was stationed in Kuwait and Iraq and served as a 91B wheeled mechanic. Malcolm was a natural leader, displaying exceptional abilities whenever given the opportunity.
